#### From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Centenary UMC Family and Friends,

During the month of September I was able to take some time away to participate in two differing Silent retreats. One was for a Day at the Surrette Farm in Statesville. It was a day of Centering Prayer. Roughly 20 lay and clergy gathered to spend from 10-4 in silence and centering prayer. We would have an opening liturgy, then 30 minutes of silence as we stayed together in the room, reflecting and praying the Scripture which was read. After the 30 minutes, a bell would ring, we would all stand up, walk slowly in a circle around the room, returning to our chair. When all participants were back, someone would read a passage from the Psalms, we would then listen and pray. When we broke for lunch, likewise it had to be in silence. The afternoon finished as we did 5 rounds of centering prayer. No introductions one to the other, only the bond of silence and prayer to unite our hearts.

This day retreat was the prelude to the 3 days away for me at the Well of Mercy in Hickory. "Well of Mercy is a ministry of hospitality and healing sponsored by the Sisters of Mercy of the Americas. It provides quiet sanctuary for adults seeking right relationship with self, others, God and creation. By offering spiritual companionship, emotional support, respectful acceptance and sacred space, it contributes to the rest and renewal of its guests." It was there that I spend 3 days in silence – away from the phone, e-mail, computer, television, and focused on prayer and discernment with God. My guided silent retreat focused on Finding the Blessing, and it was a blessing.

I know that we feel as if we have a lot of alone time. However, finding differing ways to live into your relationship with Jesus for restoration and renewal is important. I feel as if I have limited my time in community during the pandemic, but those intentional times away were different.

I had several people asked me, the person who loves conversation, if it was hard not to talk, especially during meals. It was very calming. You were to remember that Jesus is with you continually and your constant friend and partner.

This month, I would like to challenge you to spend a differing time in prayer. Try a silence as part of your day. Lean on Jesus, be in conversation with him, allowing his love to flow into the deepest part of your soul. You are his beloved and he dwells in you constantly.





During her high school years (Greensboro High School)


Dot worked retail to afford nice clothes. Her younger sister,

### **Centenary Starlight Book Club**

#### October 18, 2016 - The Rose Code by Kate Quinn

We will meet at 6:30pm on Monday, October 18th, 2021 in the Narthex

1940. As England prepares to fight the Nazis, three very different women answer the call to mysterious country estate Bletchley Park, where the best minds in Britain train to break German military codes. Vivacious debutante Osla is the girl who has everything—beauty, wealth, and the dashing Prince Philip of Greece sending her roses—but she burns to prove herself as more than a society girl, and puts her fluent German to use as a translator of decoded enemy secrets. Imperious self-made Mab, product of east-end London poverty, works the legendary codebreaking machines as she conceals old wounds and looks for a socially advantageous husband. Both Osla and Mab are quick to see the potential in local village spinster Beth, whose shyness conceals a brilliant facility with puzzles, and soon Beth spreads her wings as one of the Park's few female cryptanalysts. But war, loss, and the impossible pressure of secrecy will tear the three apart.

1947. As the royal wedding of Princess Elizabeth and Prince Philip whips post-war Britain into a fever, three friends-turned-enemies are reunited by a mysterious encrypted letter--the key to which lies buried in the longago betrayal that destroyed their friendship and left one of them confined to an asylum. A mysterious traitor has emerged from the shadows of their Bletchley Park past, and now Osla, Mab, and Beth must resurrect their old alliance and crack one last code together. But each petal they remove from the rose code brings danger--and their true enemy--closer.
